HOW DO I VOTE?

STEP 1:

Register to vote - online at Pierce County Auditor piercecountywa.org/auditor or call (253) 798-7427.

STEP 2:

Watch for your ballot and pamphlet in the mail.

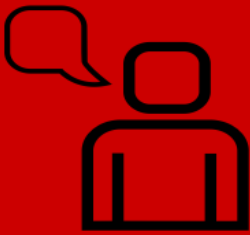
STEP 3:

Fill out your ballot and return it by mail or ballot box - on or before election day!

Who can vote?

- U.S. citizens who will be 18 by the next election.
- Felons no longer under community supervision.

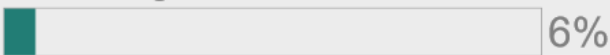

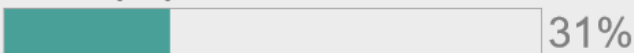
